


One of the central elements of Epiphany Learning, and in my Learner Profile. This Learner Profile allows for students to create individual learning styles, learning skills, goals, hobbies, and so much help students gain a voice in the classroom and it's great for students, and teachers.



The Learner Profile can easily help teachers see what types comfortable they feel with certain skills, what they view as their parents and teachers view as their strengths and possible career choices, and so much more.
